72-hour resident check list

Monitor bulletins on local television, radio stations and Community/Installation communication channels.

- Monitor bulletins on local television, radio stations and Community/Installation communications.
- Fill or top off your vehicle's fuel tank, check battery fluid levels and tires.
- Check batteries for radio and flashlights.
- Remove all items from balcony/patio.
- Park away from all storm drains.
- Small boat trailers should be tied down securely with boats lashed to them and filled with water.
- Put together a emergency supply kit if you have not already done so.
- Obtain an adequate supply of special/prescription medicines (two weeks' worth if possible).
- Make sure you have enough supplies to last everyone in your house for 72 hours.
- Locate the main turnoffs in your home for electricity, water and gas.
- Package your valuables, (jewelry, titles, deed insurance, licenses, inventories, etc.) for safe keeping in water proof containers. (Consider storing these some of these items in a safe deposit box.)
- Check with local kennels, veterinarians or Humane Society for safeguarding your pets and animals. Remember, public shelters do not allow pets in them with the exception of "Service Dogs." Never leave your pet chained up or alone in your home in the event you must evacuate.
- Check with Community Management office to ensure we have your correct email and mobile phone numbers. We will utilize the One-Call Now system to communicate with you.
